- 1. South Entrance is the primary/ unrestricted entrance to the Twin Ports of Duluth/Superior. The Aerial lift bridge is the only other access. This south entrance divides Minnesota & Wisconsin and is at the end of the longest freshwater beach in North America.
- 2. Park Point is the longest freshwater sandbar in North America. Sandwiched between the Lake Superior Bay and Lake Superior itself, Park Point has been here for about 5000 years.

 In 1871 the long peninsula became an island when Duluth dug out the ship canal, now connected by the arial lift bridge.
- 3. City of Superior, WI Incorporated in 1954 is home to 28000 residents. Featuring the SS Meteor Ship and the Richard I. Bong WWII museums, Superior has wetlands and natural parks with the Nemadji and Pokegama Rivers flowing into the St. Louis and Superior Bays.
- 4. Canal Park is connected to Park Point by the Arial lift bridge and is part of the Duluth mainland.
- 5. Arial lift bridge span began life in 1905 as a transporter bridge. The span was converted in 1929 to a vertical lift bridge.
- 6. City of Duluth The westernmost city on the Great Lakes. Duluth is known for its access to ocean-going ships and the running of Grandma's Marathon, which takes place along the North Shore of Lake Superior.
- 7. London Road is the main thoroughfare from East Duluth to Midtown.
- 8. Glensheen Mansion is the most visited historic home in Minnesota. It was built between 1902-1908 and has 39 rooms! The Congdon family is known for opening up iron mining in this region and setting aside land for public use.
- **99. University of MN Duluth** is part of the University of Minnesota system. It was established as the Duluth Normal School from 1902-1921, then the Duluth State Teachers College from 1921-1947.
- 10. Lester River is a 19-mile-long tributary of Lake Superior and drains an area of 58 square miles.
- ●11. St. Louis Bay is the end of the St. Louis river as it widens out to join Superior Bay. Bordered by Hwy 2, the Bong Bridge and the Blatnik Bridge, it is known for Ore docks and many industrial sites.
